SCOPE OF WORK

- I. Experiential Learning Trips in the US and internationally for Middle and High School students, which may include but are not limited to:
 - A. College Tours (Southern California, Northern California, HBCU, East Coast, etc.)
 - B. Washington DC
 - C. Service Learning
 - i. Students should have the opportunity to earn at least 10 hours of community service
 - D. International Cultural and Experiential Learning
 - E. STEM Focused
 - F. Ranch Program
 - i. Outdoor education elements
 - ii. Teambuilding
 - iii. Hands-on learning experience
 - iv. Leadership development
 - G. Farm Program
 - i. Farm to table classes
 - ii. Gardening
 - iii. Farm animal care
 - iv. Nutrition lessons
 - v. Social emotional learning
- II. Vendors should be able to provide the follow for all trips:
 - A. Student friendly hotels and lodging
 - B. Flight Reservation, check-in, ticket name changes, flight logistics, and baggage
 - C. All trip and travel meals
 - D. Trip leaders and additional program staff to provide supervision for students during the day and night (on call for emergencies) All staff should be CPR/ First Aid certified and trained in emergency protocols.
 - E. Coordination of all activities, tours and night programming.
 - F. All transportation while on trip.
 - G. Customized tours and available additional services that can be added to enhance the trip.
 - H. 24/7 access to program staff while on trip in case of emergency
 - I. Collaborate with the curriculum department to ensure that students are able to receive elective credit for completion of trips.
 - J. Program liaison to host pre-trip orientation for students and parents (make-ups should also be organized as needed). During orientation the program liaison will

- collect necessary paperwork and work with the school to ensure all pre-trip logistics are met.
- K. Program staff who will facilitate curriculum, offer tutoring throughout the trip, and support with grading.
- L. For International Trips Only:
 - i. Program staff to travel with students through immigration and customs
 - ii. Program staff to obtain all necessary visas/ travel documents for student groups
 - iii. Pre-trip cohorts and teambuilding to prepare students to travel internationally
 - iv. Organize post-trip reunions to help students reunite after their journey together upon request from the school
- M. Daily Trip Programing Should Include, but is not limited to:
 - i. Group Discussion and Activities
 - ii. Individual time for students to reflect on new experiences, observation and perseverance.
 - iii. Programing focused on Social-Emotional Learning
